Music 16D is the last of the four-quarter music theory sequence required for the music major at UC-Irvine. We begin with a review of chromatic harmony studied last term, and continue with Augmented Sixth chords an an introduction to Sonata form. (There is no Aural Skills lab associated with Music 16D.). Our study of chromatic harmony continues with augmented triads, altered dominants, common-tone sevenths and other advanced harmonies, as well as topics that straddle formal and harmonic analysis (dominant prolongation, foreign modulations, and chromatic sequence). The quarter will culminate in the performance of original compositions, with a unique format.

Texts: *The Complete Musician*, Steven Laitz, Textbook (Oxford, 2015)[ISBN 9780199347094]; any edition would do, but I will also provide pdfs for the chapters we'll use.

Assignments :

There will be **weekly assignments**, due according to the schedule posted at the class website, and quizzes **online**. There will also be regular quizzes during Friday's section based on material from the reading assignments.

Read all assigned materials before class, do preparatory analysis, and most importantly listen to the pieces we study. Class participation is of the utmost importance, as we will do a great deal of the work together in class, including partial homework assignments. I will take attendance, which will be counted in your grade. The course will culminate in performances or recordings of compositions during the final week of the quarter class. Please contact Isaac, Collin or myself if you have any questions; we will gladly answer questions or make arrangements for additional tutoring.
