- Write in the roman numerals and inversions in the score.
- On the following page, using graphic notation (slurs, figured bass symbols, NCTs, etc.), indicate the linear progressions and the linear intervallic patterns, sketching outer voices only.
- Then answer the following questions:
- considering just the outer voices, which linear intervallic pattern (sequence) that we have studied is exhibited in measures 5- 7? What makes you think so?
- what is the harmonic <u>function</u> of this sequence, in terms of starting/ending points?
- find two examples of voice exchange? Show these on your score with diagonal crossing lines.
- what linear intervallic pattern (sequence) occurs in measures 10-12, in the upper voices, over the dominant pedal? Show this on your score.
- What is the overall harmonic function of bars 1-2?
- Do you find any rules of strict counterpoint apparently broken on the surface of this music? Explain, giving measure numbers and pitches.
