Noon Concert GUIDELINES 2021-22

Create your Noon Recital in 7 Easy Steps!

Step 1 : REQUEST A RECITAL DATE

- Fill Out The Survey All students who attended the annual Production & Recitals Meeting will receive an email with a google survey link to the <u>2021-2022 Music Student</u> <u>Recital Request Survey</u> from the APM - Music in Week 1 of Fall Quarter.
- **Choose 5** Follow the instructions and fill out the survey completely. The survey requires you to choose your <u>top 5 preferred slots</u> for your recital.
- **Check** Don't Forget! Be sure to check with <u>your instructors, collaborators, collaborative</u> <u>pianist and page turners</u> before you choose the dates. You want them to be there!
- Due date This survey closes at the end of Week 3 on Sunday, October 17th at 11:59 PM. Late submission must be done by email and will be given the lowest priorities.
- Priorities Priorities will be given in the order of a) MFA/MA/PHD Graduate Student Degree Culminating Performances and Projects b) BMus Senior Recitals c) First Year MFA Recitals or degree projects d) Jazz Recitals e) Rescheduled Recitals from the last season, then f) late request submissions.

Step 2: RECITAL SUPPORT FORM

- **Support Form** You will receive your <u>Recital Support Form</u> with the assigned time and date for your recital in **Week 6 on Monday, Nov 1st.**
- **1 Week** You have **8 days (Due on Tuesday, Nov 9th)** to email or submit a hard copy of the completed and approved form. Hard copies should be placed into the APM Music's mailbox in the music office.
- **Completed Form** a completed form must have the instructor's signature, and if applicable, the signature of the staff collaborative pianists, Junko Nojima or Yuliya Minina.
- Post Date The final recital schedule will be posted online in the department's website as well as in the <u>Recital Announcement Board</u> in front of the music office in Week 10 of Fall Quarter.
- **Check** Be sure to check if your date and information are listed correctly on the recital calendar. Contact the APM Music right away if there are any errors.

No Forms, No Date!!

You risk losing your recital date if you do not return the <u>Recital Support Form</u> on Tuesday, Nov 9, 2021

Step 3: BOOK A DRESS REHEARSAL DATE

- **1 hours** Students giving a Noon recital are allotted **ONE 1-hours period** for a dress rehearsal in Winifred Smith Hall (WSH).
- Check Work with your collaborators, collaborative pianist and instructors to find a time slot that works for you, then email the APM - Music to request the time. Please note: The request must come from YOU, <u>NOT your instructors</u>.
- **Availabilities** Dress Rehearsal time is not guaranteed; we will do our best to accommodate you based on the availability of the hall.

Step 4: LEADING UP TO AND ON THE DAY OF YOUR DRESS REHEARSAL

- **Keys** You are responsible to get the necessary keys for your rehearsal. <u>The Music</u> <u>Production Office and Music Office do **NOT** support rehearsals.</u> You must acquire the keys from the music office on weekdays between 9a - 12p. You must also return the keys promptly into the key-drop box after rehearsal. Do not hold on to the keys, other students need it too.
- Weekend/Weekday Night Rehearsals You would only need to check out keys for rehearsals taking place on weekends and weekday rehearsals after 6p.
- **Piano** The Kawai baby grand is always unlocked for you to use. You must check out keys from the music office for Hamburg and New York. <u>IF you are working with Junko or Yuliya, you do **not** need to check out a key for the rehearsal.</u>
- Jazz Students Please note, no audio production support is available for your rehearsal. Also, please reserve and check out keys to MM220 if you need access to the green drum kit. Otherwise, you must bring your own drum set for the rehearsal.
- Etiquette No food and drink in Winifred Smith Hall. You can consume them outside or in the dressing room. Place the piano back into the wings after your rehearsal. Turn off all lights. Remember, there are other departments sharing the space with us. Dispose of all trash in the trash cans outs

Step 5: CREATE YOUR PROGRAM

- **Guidelines** Follow the guidelines for programs from <u>http://music.arts.uci.edu/recital-information</u> to create your program.
- **BA Projects** BA projects normally requires a full set of program notes, which must be approved by your studio instructor and/or B.A. advisors separately.
- **Bring your Programs** It is your responsibility to make the copies and bring the programs with you on the day of your concert.
- Legibility and Translation All vocal students are required to include translations of all texts not performed in English in their programs and give names of poets. You must also use legible fonts and place emphasis on clarity and professional appearances in your program design.

Step 6: SUBMIT TECHNICAL RIDER

- **Guidelines** Create your tech rider based on the <u>Technical Rider Guidelines</u> that is emailed to you from the technical rider request email by APM-music.
- **2 weeks** The rider is due to APM-Music two weeks before your recital.

Step 7: ON THE DAY OF YOUR RECITAL

- Show up to the hall @ 11:50 AM, and start the concert no later than 12:05 PM.
- Limit your set to 50 minutes maximum. You will be cut off at 12:50 PM. No Exceptions!
- **No Keys Needed** You do **NOT** need to check out keys for your recital. The production office will be supporting it.

COVID Guidelines as of 9/16/21 (Check-in for Latest Updates)

Masking in-doors - Music production is committed to follow all the necessary
precautions laid out by UCI. Performers are allowed to perform maskless while on
stage, but would need to remain masked in the back stage. Other protective measures
may be in place in the case of unvaccinated individuals with approved exceptions to be
on campus. This may include social distancing and suggested testing with a negative
result in anticipation of the public performance.

Please be in direct contact with Shih-wei if you have any concerns about this.

- **Daily Symptoms Check** Pending changes in regulation, all students/staff/faculty on stage will have to show a negative daily symptoms check to the stage manager prior to any public concert or rehearsal.
- **Rescheduling** We take the health of the UCI Music community very seriously. If performers in the recital are experiencing any symptoms and have no way of confirming negative with rapid testing. We recommend a rescheduling of the recital pending hall availability.

WHAT ELSE DO YOU NEED TO KNOW?

- **No Recordings** There will be no recording service <u>of any kind</u> for noon recitals. Please make your own arrangements for recordings.
- **Programs** YOU are responsible for creating the concert programs AND for making copies for your audience.
 - <u>Guidelines and samples are available on the department website (under Current</u> Students – Student Recital Information).
 - **o** Be sure to bring the copies with you on the day of the concert.
- **Piano Usage** Only traditional piano usage is allowed on our instruments (feet on the pedals, hands on keys). Any non-conventional techniques on the piano must be approved by the piano faculty prior to the concert.
- **Collaborative Pianist** You are responsible to coordinate and book your collaborative pianist. There is a list of collaborative pianists available in the Music Office. If you have any questions, please speak with Prof. Nina Scolnik.
- **No Receptions** Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate recital receptions for NOON concerts due to classes.

If you missed the Welcome Week Production & Recital meeting, you must email the Assistant Production Manager-Music for a make-up session.
